

Judy has been serving in Thailand with BMS World Mission since 1999 in several contexts and with different groups of people. With her nursing skills, she started work in a community health project for people affected by HIV. She also helped at Agape Home for children and parents living with Aids.

In 2007, Judy set up and remains nurse manager of Hope Home in Chiang Mai for special needs children and young adults. Alongside this role, she supports the Social Development Services Unit, a team of social welfare workers in the Church of Christ in Thailand.

Judy attends a Thai church. She loves all types of needlecraft, reading, crosswords and walking.

Hope Home is registered as a social welfare home under the Baan Sabaay Foundation. They are committed to small, family based care and support for children with special needs in Northern Thailand. The Home believes that all children, including those with disabilities are an integral part of the community and that all benefit from the full inclusion of people with disabilities in the community. Therefore, they work to empower children to full participation in every environment. The staff aim to demonstrate the love of God through their Christian witness and care of children with special needs in order to promote the maximum development for each child with the aim that each child is accepted into a permanent family setting.
